TRAKKA BUILDS ARTIST DENNIS BAKER A MURALED STUDIO-ON-WHEELS...

The artist Dennis Baker has just taken delivery of his new Studio-on-Wheels; a **Trakka Jabiru Xtra** – complete with reproductions of his work ‘Kakadu’ down both sides – and matching ‘Kakadu’ number plates.

A celebrated Australian artist and well known Sydney art dealer, Dennis commissioned the special **Trakka Jabiru Xtra** to use as a mobile studio for his frequent travels around the country. From humble beginnings in the late 1970s, when first commissioned to draw sketches and paint outback scenes for Overlander 4WD magazine, Dennis is now internationally recognised and best known for his Kakadu series.

When looking for a motorhome, Dennis, a previous Trakka owner and lover of all-things Kakadu, decided the new Jabiru *had* to be the one.

“I thought it ironic for Trakka to build a motorhome bearing the name of Kakadu’s only town and Australia’s only stork, from which the town takes its name. And so to

compliment the vehicle I decided to have one of my most popular works – Kakadu – reproduced down the sides; and fit ‘Kakadu’ number plates just to finish it off.” said Dennis, who also admits to being attracted by the all-new styling and high standard of workmanship.

The murals are reproduced in vinyl and, using the latest technology, cover the side windows while still allowing light in and a view out.

The very special **Trakka Jabiru Xtra** is built on the all-new Mercedes Benz Sprinter and loaded with goodies. These include metallic paint in lustrous deep Jasper blue, alloy wheels, parchment leather upholstery and bi-xenon headlights with cornering function.

Inside, the parchment leather upholstery continues throughout, there’s roof-mounted airconditioning, a 15” LCD TV with integrated DVD, diesel-fired Airtronic heater with timer, a reversing camera, rear parking sensors and a navigation system, in addition to the high level of standard equipment.
